Lora Lynn Christensen, NCTM

Lora Lynn Christensen, NCTM, grew up in New Mexico in the famous Hatch Valley, then moved to Silver City and earned a Bachelor of Arts at Western New Mexico University. She married and moved to Baton Rouge, where she attended one semester of graduate work at Louisiana State University. When her husband Don graduated from LSU, they moved to Hays, Kansas; Mrs. Christensen completed her Master of Music at Ft. Hays Kansas State University. Don's work in the oil field led them next to Abilene, Texas, where they have enjoyed getting involved in the community.

Mrs. Christensen has accompanied and taught at all three local universities—Abilene Christian University, Hardin-Simmons University, and currently McMurry University. She has accompanied numerous recitals and musicals at all three universities, as well as at Abilene Community Theater, Paramount Productions, and local high schools.

After many years and offices at every level in PTA, she served on the AISD School Board from 1998-2002 and helped found Abilene Opera Association. She is a 50-year member of Abilene Music Teachers Association (TMTA, MTNA) and Harmony Club of Abilene. Mrs. Christensen started the Junior festival in Abilene, and she began the AMTA Showcase Concert 25 years ago. This concert has become a benefit for Harmony Family Services (a children's shelter). She played for 15 years as pianist for Abilene Fine Arts Trio. She is currently church pianist at St. James United Methodist Church. She has served as president of the Abilene Kiwanis Club of Abilene and is incoming chair of the Harmony Family Services Board. She also served many years on the board of Young Audiences of Abilene; she chaired this board in 2011.

Mrs. Christensen has accompanied the Celebration Singers, Abilene's Premier Show Choir, for over 25 years. She is currently the Director, planning two programs presented to the community each year. In the past, Mrs. Christensen has had the privilege of playing for several NFMC Young Artists.

Now, prepared to serve a second term as TFMC President, she wants to thank all the presidents and officers who have served previously and who continue to do so.

Lights up! A New Theater! Opera in the Ozarks Federation Days, July 22-25, 2025

In the opening words of Stephen Sondheim's wonderful musical, *Into the Woods*, "I wish."

- I wish......you could have been there to see the magnificence of the new theater, standing proudly against the backdrop of Inspiration Point views of the White River and the Ozark Mountains:
- I wish......you could have felt the electricity in the air as patrons and actors experienced the reality of the dream that has come true;
- I wish......you could have heard the voices of the 37 talented young performers who shared their incredible vocal gifts so generously, not only at the operas—Into the Woods, The Merry Widow, and Carmen—but also at the Broadway Cabaret, Federation Day luncheons, and dinner!

Opera in the Ozarks now offers the opera experience the way it was meant to be: a beautiful, comfortable space; 300 comfortable seats; state of the art technology and acoustics; and a welcoming lobby. Reality check from General Director Nancy Preis reminded us that while the construction was funded by a generous gift from the Walton Foundation, the operation, overhead, and upkeep are the responsibility of patrons and supporters. The Inspiration Point Center for the Arts organization will develop income-producing activities (including weddings), as well as community involvement opportunities. Ms. Preis announced that attendance in 2025 was approximately 46,000 compared to 32,000 in 2024.

You need go only once to understand how vital Opera In the Ozarks is for developing the next generation of opera singers. Donations from individuals, clubs, districts and regions of NFMC are more than worthwhile; they are critical. Be part of the continuing legacy of Opera in the Ozarks. Consider joining OIO https://operaintheozarks.com/patrons/ for all the latest information as soon as it's available. Maestro Thomas Cockrell has announced that the operas next season will be Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi* and *Suor Angelica*, Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro*, and Bernstein's *Candide*. Watch this space for the dates in July 2026.




